George Washington

1st President 📩 1789 - 1797

Vice President – John Adams

"It is **better** to offer **no excuse** than a bad one." George Washington

The **ONLY**

President to have been unanimously selected by the Electoral College.

Played a key role in drafting the Constitution.



Participated to keep order and provide a deciding vote on proposals.

Formed the **first** presidential cabinet.

MARTHA

WASHINGTON





Commonly referred to as "Lady Washington".

Martha is one of only two women (the other being Pocahontas) to have appeared on U.S. paper currency.



Born on February 22, 1732,

Virginia

in Westmoreland Co, VA.

GEORGA

SHINGTO

Died December 14, 1799.

Oct. 17,1781

Led the continental army to **victory** over the British.

135 words

Washington's 2nd inaugural speech was the **shortest** ever given.





2nd President 📩 1797 - 1801

Vice President – Thomas Jefferson

2 JOHA 2 Junit ADAMS

Massachusetts

"I **must** study **politics and war** that my sons may have liberty to study **mathematics and philosophy**."

John Adams

FIRST President to live in the White House.

Participated in drafting the Declaration of Independence

John Quincy Adams

Adams' son became the **6th** President of the United States.

Graduated from Harvard College in 1755.



ADAMS

Father of the Navy

Abigail was a big advocate for women's access to education.

With no access to education herself, Abigail was self-taught from the books in her father's library. Born on October 30, 1735, in Braintree (Quincy), MA.

Died July 4, 1826.

Established a **naval force** when the threat of war with France with looming.



Adams was a hopeless romantic and wrote **THOUSANDS** of love letters to his wife.



Thomas Jefferson

3rd President 🛨 1801 - 1809

Vice Presidents – Aaron Burr & George Clinton

"We hold these **truths** to be self-evident: that **all men** are created **equal**..."

Thomas Jefferson



6,500 piece book collection to the Library of Congress after it was raided in 1814.

Before becoming President, Jefferson was a part of drafting the Declaration of Independence.



Born on April 13, 1743, in Goochland (Albemarle) County, VA.

Died July 4, 1826.

the Louisiana Purchase in **1803**

Completed

this doubled the size of the U.S. at the time.



MARTHA

The Pen of the Revolution

Martha did not live to see Jefferson become President.

No facial image of Martha remains. This painting of her was created based off modern descriptions of her physical attributes. After the Louisiana Purchase, Jefferson sent two people out to explore the new territory.

James Madison

4th President ★ 1809 - 1817

Vice Presidents – George Clinton & Elbridge Gerry

"The **happy** Union of these States is a **wonder**; their Constitution a **miracle**; their example the **hope** of Liberty throughout the world."

Issued until 1969, the

Historians believe that Madison wrote George Washington's **first** inaugural address. James Madison

Virginia

Born on March 16, 1751, in Port Conway, VA.

MAL

Died June 28, 1836.

5'4'' The SHORTEST president.

DOLLEY

MADISON

Father of the Constitution-

Dolley began the tradition of inaugural balls and was the first to redecorate the White House.

When the British invaded D.C. during the War of 1812, Dolley saved valuables from the White House before it was burned down. Madison took part in writing the Federalist Papers alongside Alexander Hamilton & John Jay to promote the ratification of the Constitution.

Madison and George Washington were the **ONLY presidents who** signed the Constitution.

James Monroe

5th President ★ 1817 - 1825

Vice President – Daniel D. Tompkins

"In a representative republic, the education of our children must be of the utmost importance!" James Monroe

Monroe held more government offices than any other President. By the time Monroe's presidency was over, he had served the U.S. for

years.



ELIZABETH

FORTRIGHT MONT

The Last of the Crooked Hats

Accompanied Monroe to France when Washington appointed him U.S. Minister.

Elizabeth was loved by the people in France and was given the affectionate nickname of *la belle Américaine*.

Born on April 28, 1758, in Westmoreland Co, VA.

Virginia

AMES

Died July 4, 1831.



Purchased Florida from Spain for \$5,000,000,000 – at this time, Florida became a territory of the U.S, but was not admitted as a state until **1845**.

The Monroe Doctrine

1823

A policy created to stop other nations from interfering with the Western hemisphere.

John Quincy Adams

6th President ★ 1825 - 1829

Vice President – John C. Calhoun

"If your actions **inspire** others to **dream** more, **learn** more, **do** more and **become** more, you are a **leader**." John Quincy Adams

Massachusetts

FIRST President whose father was also President in the past – John Adams.

First became a lawyer after receiving his Masters from **Harvard.**

As the Secretary of State under James Monroe, Adams helped draft the **Monroe Doctrine**.

LOUISA

CATHERINE ADAT

Old Man Eloquent

The first First Lady to be born outside of the United States.

Born in London, Louisa did not move to the U.S. until 4 years after marrying John Quincy Adams.

Born on July 11, 1767, in Braintree (Quincy), MA.

Died February 23, 1848.

The ONLLY President to enter Congress after their Presidential term – became a representative for Massachusetts





Adams served in the House of Representatives for 18 years.



Jackson led his troops to **victory** against the British in the Battle of New Orleans in 1815.

7th President

The duties of the First Lady then fell

to Rachel's niece, Emily Donelson.

ONELSON JACKSOR

Martin Van Buren

8th President ★ 1837 - 1841

Vice President – Richard M. Johnson

"It is **easier** to do a job **right** than to **explain** why you **didn't**." Martin Van Buren

The **ONLY**

President to not have English as their first language. Van Buren's first language was Dutch.

Only received formal education through the age of

Studied law on his own and passed the bar exam in **1803**.

HANNAH

Little Magician



Hannah died before Van Buren took office.

Van Buren's son married Angelica Singleton in 1838 and Angelica was the one who took on the roles of the First Lady.

Born on December 5, 1782, in Kinderhook, NY.

New York

Died July 24, 1862.

The **FIRST** President to be born as a **U.S. citizen**. All previous presidents were born as **British subjects**.



The Panic of 1837

One of Van Buren's primary concern while in office - this was when the stock market crashed, and an economic depression began.

William H. Harrison

9th President 🛨 March 4 – April 4, 1841

Vice President – John Tyler

"The only **legitimate** right to govern is an express **grant** of **power** from the **governed**."

William Henry Harrison

Harrison gave the **LONGEST**

Ever inaugural address – 1 hour & 45 minutes.

Originally, Harrison wanted to be a **doctor** and attended **Pennsylvania Medical School** before dropping out to join the military.

William and Anna **eloped** and got married in secret.

Born on February 9, 1773, in Berkeley, VA.

Virginia

Died April 4, 1841.

Harrison was the **SHORTEST**

serving President in U.S. history. Just **1 month** after taking office, Harrison fell victim to a fatal case of pneumonia.



HARRISON

Old Tip

Anna who delayed her move to Washington due to illness, but never made it there before Harrison passed.

Congress voted to give Anna a pension equivalent to Harrison's salary, thus setting a precedent for the pensions of subsequent first ladies. William & Anna had **10** kids. Their **5th** child, John is the father of the **23rd** President, Benjamin Harrison.

John Tyler 10th President **★** 1841 - 1845

Vice President – None

"Nature governs man by no principle more fixed than that which leads him to pursue his interest." John Tyler

Signed a bill that admitted Florida and Texas into the Union.

1845

Tyler's presidency is not seen in high regard.

The first Vice President to take over for the President after William Henry Harrison's death.

JULIA

CARDINER TYLES

in Charles City County, VA. Died January 18, 1862.

Born on March 29, 1790,

Tyler had

Virginia



1841

Tyler vetoed a bill to set up a national bank. Because of this, his entire cabinet resigned, and he was expelled from the Whig party.

Known as the "Rose of Long Island".

Julia and John were the first couple to marry while holding the presidential office.

His Accidency

James K. Polk

11th President ★ 1845 - 1849

Vice President – George M. Dallas

11 SAMES 11 SAMES POLK

"Peace, plenty, and contentment reign throughout our borders, and our beloved country presents a sublime moral spectacle to the world."

James K. Polk

Before his presidency, Polk served as Speaker of the House from

1835-1839

Then leaving that role to become the Governor of Tennessee.

Polk did not start formal education until the age of 18.

SARAH

CHILDRESS POL

Young Hickory

Sarah was highly educated and attended one of the few high level education centers for women – The Moravians' Female Academy.

Sarah used her education to help Polk write his speeches. But this had to be done in private because women had no role in politics at the time.

11th President

Born on November 2, 1795, in Mecklenburg Co, NC.

North

Carolina

Died June 15, 1849.

Polk's presidential nomination came as a

SURPRISE

to everyone, including himself.



Polk believed in this theory and the idea that the United States was destined to expand across North America.

Zachary Taylor 12th President ★ 1849 - 1850

Vice President – Millard Fillmore

"Never judge a stranger by their clothes."

Taylor was known for appearing "disheveled", wearing a straw hat and farm clothes under his officer's jacket.

Taylor never attended college.

Grew up in the frontier country and had little formal education.

"Old Whitey"

Taylor's horse was kept on the front lawn of the White House. Born on November 24, 1784, in Orange County, VA.

Died July 9, 1850.

Served

Virginia

years in the army.

Taylor's willingness to share the hardships of field duty with his men earned him his nickname.



ALL TAYLOR

Old Rough & Ready

Zachary Taylor

Margaret went by "Peggy".

Peggy fell ill and left most of her duties to her daughter, Betty Taylor.

Fought in FOUR wars:

- 1. War of 1812
- 2. Black Hawk War
- 3. Second Seminole War
- 4. Mexican-American War

Millard Fillmore

13th President ★ 1850 - 1853

Vice President – None

"It is not strange...to make change for progress."

Did not begin formal school until the age of

Fillmore then ended up marrying his teacher – Abigail Powers.

Self-Taught Lawyer

Passed the exam to practice law at age **23**, and then opened his own law firm near Buffalo, NY.





Last of the Whigs

Abigail was the first First Lady to hold a job after marriage.

Abigail kept her career of being a teacher because of her constant eagerness to learn and the love of teaching others. Millard & his wife created their own White House Library with a collection of 1,050 books personally selected by them both.

13th President

Born on January 7, 1800, in Cayuga County, NY.

Millard Fillmore

Died March 8, 1874.

One of the **5** Presidents to not be formally elected into office – Filmore became President after Zachary Taylor's unexpected death.

Franklin Pierce

14th President ★ 1853 - 1857

Vice President – William R. King

"If your past is limited, your future is boundless."

Franklin's inaugural speech was **3,319** words & given all from memory – **NO NOTES**.

Purchased land in the Southwest which today includes southern New Mexico and Arizona for

\$10,000,000

First president to put a Christmas tree in the White House. Franklin Pierce

Born on November 23, 1804, in Hillsboro, NH.

TER

New

Hampshire

Died October 8, 1869.

Pierce did not have a **middle name**.



JANE

HEANS PIERCE



The death of Jane's third child occurred right before Pierce's inauguration.

The whole nation shared in Jane and Franklin's grief.

"Purse" is how Franklin pronounced his last name.

Kansas-Nebraska Act

Supported this act which put an end to the Missouri Compromise and allowed states to choose whether they would allow slavery or not. This set the stage for the **Civil War**.

James Buchanan

15th President ★ 1857 - 1861

Vice President – John C. Breckinridge



Pennsylvania

"The test of **leadership** is not to put greatness into humanity, but to elicit it, for the greatness is already there."

James Buchanan

During Buchanan's administration, the **Union broke apart**.

By the end of his term,

states had left the Union.

The Civil War was looming.

The **ONLY** President to **never** marry.

HARRIET

LANE

Old Buck

Buchanan had his 27-year-old niece – Harriet Lane take on as his hostess in office.

Harriet became very popular and got nicknamed the "Democratic Queen".

Born on April 23, 1791, in Cove Gap, PA.

Died June 1, 1868.

James Buchanan Hotel



Buchanan's childhood home was later turned into a hotel.

65 when he was elected into office.

The Dred Scott Ruling

Supported this ruling which stated that the federal government had **no power to ban slavery**. Although Buchanan himself was against slavery, he believed strongly in the law and wanted to avoid Civil War at all costs.

Abraham Lincoln 16th President ★ 1861 - 1865 Whatever you are, be a good one." Abraham Lincoln Kentucky Gettysburg Address November 19, 1863Born on February 12, 1809, in Hodgenville, KY. Four score and seven year ago..." Died April 15, 1865. a 272-word speech given at the official dedication ceremony for the National First president to be born Cemetery of Gettysburg in PA. outside of the original 13 colonies. **Presidential Library** April 14, 1865 & Museum Established the U.S.

MARY

Secret Service -

ironically, same day of his assassination.



Mary was known to be a "vivacious, intelligent and witty" woman.

During the Civil War, Mary volunteered as nurse in the Union army hospitals.

Lincoln issued the **Emancipation Proclamation**

The TALLEST President

on **January 1, 1863**, that began the process of freeing all slaves across the U.S.

16th President

ODD LINCOLA

Andrew Johnson

17th President 🛨 1865 - 1869

"Honest conviction is my courage; the Constitution is my guide."

Andrew Johnson

North

Carolina



Johnson moved to Tennessee as a teenager where he started his own successful tailoring business.

During the Civil War, Johnson was the **ONLY** southern legislator to continue working for the U.S. government after his state of Tennessee left the Union.



Purchased Alaska from Russia for \$7.2 million in GOLD.

ELIZA

The Veto President

Eliza & Andrew got married at ages 16 and 18.

Johnson never went to school – Eliza taught Johnson to read and write more fluently as well as how to do arithmetic. Johnson vetoed legislation that Congress passed to protect the rights of those who had been freed from slavery.

Born on December 29,

1808, in Raleigh, NC.

Died July 31, 1875

Johnson won his trial and was allowed to remain in office.

First U.S. president to

be impeached.







In her words, Julie's time in the White House was "the happiest period" of her life.

ENT GRAN

Julie was a very popular hostess known for entertaining extensively and lavishly.

Grant is well-known for leading the U.S. to **victory** over the Confederate states.

Rutherford B. Hayes

19th President ★ 1877 - 1881

Vice President – William A. Wheeler



"To vote is like the payment of a debt, a duty never to be neglected, if its performance is possible." Rutherford B. Hayes

The first annual White House Ester Egg roll was held on

April 22, 1878

when Hayes agreed to open the White House grounds on Easter Monday.

Hayes is known for winning one of the closest presidential elections in history. Many believe he won by fraud, earning him the nickname. This tradition still happens today!



Born on October 4, 1822, in Delaware, OH.

Died January 17, 1893.

1877 Hayes ordered the last of the federal troops to leave the Southern states.

LUCY

[•] His Fraudulency

Lucy was the first first lady to have earned a college degree.

Lucy drew attention to the importance of those who came before her and set precedents for those who came after. The "B" in Rutherford B. Hayes stand for **Birchard**.

Hayes wrote about Lucy in his diary -"Her low sweet voice is very winning.... A heart as true as steel.... Intellect she has too.... By George! I am in love with her!"



James Garfield

20th President 📩 1881

Vice President – Chester Arthur

20 SAME 20 Control of the second seco

"If wrinkles must be written on our brows, let them not be written upon the heart. The spirit should never grow old." James Garfield



There were 6 presidents born in a **log cabin**, and Garfield was the last one.

Garfield's presidency only lasted **200** days before he was assassinated on July 2,1881.

Garfield stated the end of slavery being "the most important political change" since the Constitution.





Born on November 19, 1831, in Orange, OH.

Died September 19, 1881.

Garfield was Civil War hero.

President Lincoln at the time convinced Garfield to resign from his military post and devote his time to advocating for Ohio in the House of Representatives.

Garfield was then re-elected into this position for 18 years before becoming President.

> This also made Garfield the **ONLY** sitting House member to ever become President.

REDOLPH GARFIELD

Preacher President

Lucretia was said to "grow up to every new emergency with fine tact and faultless taste."

She proved this in the eyes of the nation, though she was always a reserved, self-contained woman.

Chester Arthur

21st President 📩 1881 - 1885



Arthur graduated from Union College in New York and became a **teacher** before starting Law School.



Arthur passed the bar exam and started practicing law in New York.

Working as an attorney in New York, Arthur won several high-profile civil rights cases.

One of his won cases helped to desegregate public transportation in NYC.

ELLEN





Born on October 5, 1830, in Fairfield, VT.

Died November 18, 1886.



Arthur signed this bill into law that made the selection of government employees may only be selected by competitive exams instead of personal affiliations.

Elegant Arthur.

Ellen passed away a little less than a year before Arthur took office as President.

Mary Arthur McElroy – Arthur's sister filled the role and duties of the first lady.

The name "Elegant Arthur" came from his appreciation for fashion. Throughout each day, Arthur changed his outfit for every occasion.

Arthur reportedly owned over pairs of pants.

21st President



Chester Arthur

Grover Cleveland

22nd & 24th President 🛧 1885 - 1889 / 1893 - 1897

Vice Presidents – Thomas Hendricks & Adlai Stevenson

"A cause worth **fighting** for is worth fight for **until the end**." Grover Cleveland

The **ONLY** President in American history to serve **non-consecutive terms**.

Stephen

Cleveland's legal name is actually **Stephen Grover Cleveland**.

1882 Became the mayor of Buffalo, New York.

1883 Became the governor of New York.

FRANCES

Orsom CLEVELAN

Grover the Good

Frances became the youngest first lady at the age of 21.

Frances became a very influential first lady. She set trends for hairstyles and fashion.



Born on March 18, 1837, in Caldwell, NJ.

Died June 24, 1908.

Cleveland's first career was in education – he was a teacher at the **New York Institute** for the Blind.

Controversial **Vetoes**

Cleveland was known for some of his controversial vetoes regarding Civil War veteran pensions.



The **only** President to ever be **married IN** the White House.

22nd & 24th President

Benjamin Harrison

23rd President 🛧 1889 - 1893

Vice President – Levi P. Morton

BL MUA 23 CONTRACTOR

Born on August 20, 1833,

in North Bend, OH.

Died March 13, 1901.

Worked as a lawyer

until the Civil War

broke out and he joined

the Union Army.

Signed the Sherman Antitrust Act

Graduated from

Miami University in Ohio studying law.

Benjamin Harrison

Ohio

Harrison came from quite the famous political family with his great grandfather (Benjamin Harrison) signing the Declaration of Independence, his grandfather (William H. Harrison) being the 9th President of the United States and his father (John Harrison) a U.S. Congressman.

The first president to have his voice recorded.

The first – president to have **ELECTRICITY** in the White House.

The "human iceberg".

CAROLINE

The Front Porch Campaigner

Caroline received a degree in music, art & literature from Oxford Female Institute.

Caroline also helped found the National Society of the daughters of the American Revolution (DAR). Harrison received this nickname because during the 1888 election, he gave nearly **90** speeches from his front porch to crowds that gathered in his front yard.

25th President 🗙 1897 - 1901

Vice Presidents – Garret Hobart & Theodore Roosevelt

"That's all a man can **hope** for during his **lifetime** - to **set an example** – and when he I dead, to be an **inspiration for history**." William McKinley

McKinley is most known for being President during the **Spanish-American War**.

As a result of the war, the U.S. took control of Cuba, the Philippine Islands, and Puerto Rico.

When vice president Hobart died, Harrison replaced him with the popular **Theodore Roosevelt**.

First president to ride in an

THIN MCKINIE

Ohio

Born on January 29, 1843, in Niles, OH.

Died September 14, 1901.

McKinley was **reelected for his second term** – just 6 months before he was shot and killed.

\$500

McKinley's face appears on the front of the 500-dollar bill.

Ida and McKinley met while she was working at her father's bank as a cashier.

Major

Ida suffered with epilepsy while McKinley was in office and played a more reserved role as First Lady. As president, McKinley focused his efforts on making the United States **"a world** of power".

25th President

Theodore Roosevelt

26th President ★ 1901 - 1909

Vice President – Charles W. Fairbanks

"A vote is like a rifle: its usefulness depends upon the character of the user."



The first president to fly in an **airplane**.

"Rough Riders"

When the Spanish-American war broke out, Roosevelt put together a volunteer company of cowboys, college football players, NYC police officers & Native Americans.

United States Forest Service

Roosevelt established **150 national** forests and **5 national parks** during his time in office.

Roosevelt went blind in his left eye during his term from a boxing match injury. EDITH

GROW ROOSEVE

Theodore Roosevelt



LEOD

Born on October 27, 1858, in New York, NY.

Died January 6, 1919.

"The first modern president."

Graduated from Harvard University

but dropped out of grad school (at Columbia University) before he got his law degree.

Soon after, Roosevelt went out West to work as a **cowboy** & **rancher**.

Teddy

The first First Lady to employ a full-time social secretary.

This resulted in the creation of an • official social staff and elevated the position of First Lady. The "teddy bear" was named after Roosevelt.



First President to receive the Nobel Peace Prize for negotiating an end to a war between Russia and Japan.

William Taft 27th President ★ 1909 - 1913

Vice President – James S. Sherman

27 Jan

"I am in favor of helping the prosperity of all countries because, when we are all prosperous, the trade with each becomes more valuable to

the other."

William Taft

The **ONLY** president to serve on the Supreme Court after leaving office.

As the **Chief Justice**, this made Taft the **only** former president to swear in a new president.

Taft swore in not one, but **TWO** presidents – **Calvin Coolidge** and **Herbert Hoover**.

After presidency but before being the Chief Justice, Taft was a **law professor** at Yale.

HELEN

HERRON TAFA



Helen helped coordinate the planting of 3,000 Japanese cherry blossom trees around the Tidal Basin on the Washington D.C. National Mall.

These trees continue to be a tourist destination every spring when they are in bloom.

Taft was the **LAST** president to keep a cow at the White House to provide fresh milk.



Ohio

Started the tradition of throwing out the first ball of the MLB baseball season.

27th President

Died March 8, 1930.

Born on September 15,

1857, in Cincinnati, OH.



The first president to **own** a car.

At Yale, Taft was a **heavyweight** wrestling champion.

Woodrow Wilson noD. 28th President ★ 1913 - 1921 "Friendship is the only cement that will ever hold the world together." Virginia Woodrow Wilson Taught as a political science professor for over 15 years at Princeton University. Wilson's earliest memory as a child was hearing that Abraham Lincoln had been elected Born on December 28. president and that war was coming. 1856, in Staunton, VA. Thomas Died February 3, 1924. Wilson's legal name is actually Wilson was president Thomas Woodrow Wilson. during World War I. **League of Nations** A group of countries

Wilson's face appears on the front of the **\$100,000** bill.

EDITH

BOLLING WILSOF

The Professor

Edith was Wilson's second wife and married during his first term.

When Wilson suffered from a major stroke in 1919, Edith pre-screened all matters of the state for the remainder of Wilson's second term.

The League of Nations was a part of the **Treaty of Versailles** – a peace treaty signed at the end of World War I.

This was Harding's presidential campaign slogan – making him win by a landslide because voters wanted things to go back to normal after World War I.

> 9th Amendment Harding was the first president elected after women received the right to vote.

Wobbly Warren

Florence was a significant political force in Harding's administration.

After Harding's sudden death, his reputation was tarnished by a series of corruption scandals being uncovered.

The U.S. Navy held valuable oil reserves at Teapot Dome, WY.

Teapot Dome Scandal

Harding's Secretary of the Interior, Albert Fall, needed money and decided to secretly sell some of these reserves to oil companies.



Calvin Coolidge

30th President 🛨 1923 - 1929

Vice President – Charles Gates Dawes

"I have noticed that **nothing** I have **never** said ever did me any **harm**." Calvin Coolidge

Coolidge was a man of few words, which is how he got his nickname **"Silent Cal"**.

The Roaring Twenties

During his presidency, was a time of fast-paced social, cultural and technological changes.

The **LONGEST** serving American president. Roosevelt served a total of FOUR terms.

After his presidency, a law was made that allowed presidents to serve a **MAXIMUM** of two terms.
